The Earned Income Tax Credit is a refundable Federal income tax credit for low to moderate income working individuals and families.

## FREE HELP IS AVAILABLE!

The IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program and the Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) Program offer free tax help, if you qualify. Trained community volunteers can help you with special credits, such as the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), Child Tax Credit, and Credit for the Elderly.
